The Perfect Work of God in Christ

Dear Friend;

Part of what I am doing is shifting the emphasis from proclaiming a belief in Christ through words to the demonstration of that belief evident by these words of Jesus: *John 13:34-35 (NIV)* ³⁴ "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵by this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." That is why I am putting the emphasis on the understanding that we should "Love our neighbors as ourselves", which was determined to be the single command that is most important.

The Guidelines page at www.CreativeLightFiltering.org expounds on this objective. I am hoping somehow to have an impact with both Christians and non-Christians including Atheists. I am hoping my reading, writing, and collaboration will enable this to happen, while we keep the mission and guidelines in mind.

I think Jesus' words suggest that he himself is most interested in how we act towards our fellow man, and less on our words of belief. Perhaps this is related to these confirmation memory verse words I had: *John 8:31-32* (*NIV*)³¹ To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. ³² Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."
